


The last many years of the Foundation's operations have witnessed the association and participation of eminent Rajasthanis settled in India and abroad in large numbers.



Onnecting with NRRs

- RF has been reaching out to Pravasis settled in India and abroad and connecting them with their homeland. Connections with NRRs settled in over 30 countries have been successfully established, including links with Rajasthani Associations in various countries.
- RF has been instrumental in connecting with ${\tt potential}\, investors\, through\, its\, vast\, database\, of$ NRRs. Various programs/ events are organized to engage with the Pravasi community constantly. These include:
- Engaging young children through events like folk tale-telling sessions and organizing interactions with youth icons to inspire the

- $younger\,generation\,to\,connect\,with\,Rajasthan.$
- Regular programs like Hum Rajasthani and Miliye Sarkar Se are organized to keep the NRRs engaged with inspiring NRRs and also with the Government of Rajasthan.
- Celebrating festivals like Teej, Makar Sankranti, Diwali, etc, with the global Pravasis in hybrid mode. Several NRRs participate enthusiastically online in the festivals organized by the Rajasthan Foundation.
- Participating in business meets and cultural events, including those organized by the Rajasthani Associations and organizations.



Covid Crisis: RF has been acting as a bridge for NRRs in the hour of any calamity. During the first wave of Covid-19, the safe passage was ensured to hometowns in Rajasthan for migrants stranded in the country and abroad.

During the second wave of the Corona pandemic, Rajasthani Diaspora extended a helping hand through the Rajasthan Foundation and provided large quantities of oxygen concentrators, medical oxygen, other equipment, etc.

Ukraine Response: Having been appointed as the nodal organization by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Rajasthan Foundation played a key role during the Ukraine crisis. It successfully coordinated between the Central Government authorities, students, and local administration and safely brought back more than 1000 students stranded in Ukraine to their hometown, free of costs.

Grievance Redressal

A separate section for NRRs is now available on State Government's Sampark portal to enable them to register their grievances online.

An NRRs cell in each district, under the local administration, with a nodal officer, is also being established to serve as a point of contact for resolving issues and problems faced by NRRs.



The telemedicine platform was developed to provide free-of-cost consultation to residents of Rajasthan with the help of the Doctors of Rajasthan International (DORI) organization platform.



Web Portal for NRRs

A special web portal has been developed for NRRs to act as a one-stop information resource on Rajasthan's natural advantages, tourist places, philanthropic and investment opportunities, district-wise details, history, culture, heritage, latest Government schemes, initiatives, latest news, events, etc.



NRR Policy

The Government of Rajasthan has approved the NRR Policy, which envisions empowerment and support to a vibrant, diverse Rajasthani Diaspora connected to Rajasthan and to each other and actively participates in economic, social, and cultural domains of the State. The five C's, pillars of the policy are: - Connect, Culture, Community, Care and Contribution.

Under the visionary leadership of Shri Ashok Gehlot, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Rajasthan, the Government of Rajasthan was a pioneer in recognizing the importance of its Diaspora and was among the first States to set up a dedicated organization in March 2001, namely the Rajasthan Foundation (RF).

Rajasthan Foundation has been set up under the Rajasthan Societies Registration Act 1958 as a forum for strengthening and renewing the bonds between Non-Resident Rajasthanis (NRRs) and the State of their origin.
