The pursuit of being, is what drives the works of Arshita Yadav, an artist born and brought up in a city of unmatched cultural heritage and crafts refined over centuries of traditions, Jaipur. Having been trained in professional aspects of art, that is, Architecture and Design, Arshita draws parallels between the traditional and modern through her art. Her excessive focus on detailing the minute while maintaining the bigger vision intact is what drives the finesse in her works. Working as an interdisciplinary designer in Delhi, Arshita has created art across diverse dimensions and mediums, ranging from intricate paper works to largescale installations. Her artistic expression extends seamlessly into her professional practice, whether designing spaces, crafting furniture, or spending a quiet afternoon immersed in painting. A keen eye for detailing which when coupled with avid reading gives her the ideas to explore the unsaid. He curated the first exhibition on the evolution of Shatranj in India, featuring rare Chaturanga sets at the Red Fort, celebrated for reviving traditional ivory carving crafts. Through "Open Play" and "Khol Khel," Aman has revived India's play traditions. "Khol Khel" has developed notable projects like the award-winning QBoid and the revival of "Rajju Sarpa," featured at the G20 meet in 2023 and now part of educational curricula. His work was recently showcased in the Republic Day Parade tableau and has gained national prominence. Aman has contributed to exhibitions like the WHC event at Bharat Mandapam and Vishwakarma Divas in Wardha. He also curated the play experience for 'Prerna,' a model school in Vadnagar, integrating traditional knowledge with modern education. Through an MoU with Srishti Manipal Institute of Design, he is advancing innovative design projects and establishing a Center of Excellence for Traditional Knowledge. Aman Gopal exemplifies the harmonious blend of cultural preservation and modern innovation, making him a key figure in reviving India's rich traditions. His work reflects a vision deeply rooted in cultural identity while embracing modern paradigms.

Meenaxi Nimiwal Dubai Native place-Sardarshahar, Churu Rajasthan








Vivek Paliya Punjab Native place- Jaipur, Rajasthan


Raj Gopal Sureka Kolkata Native place- Ratangarh, Churu, Rajasthan








Artwork of Pravasi Children from Oman
