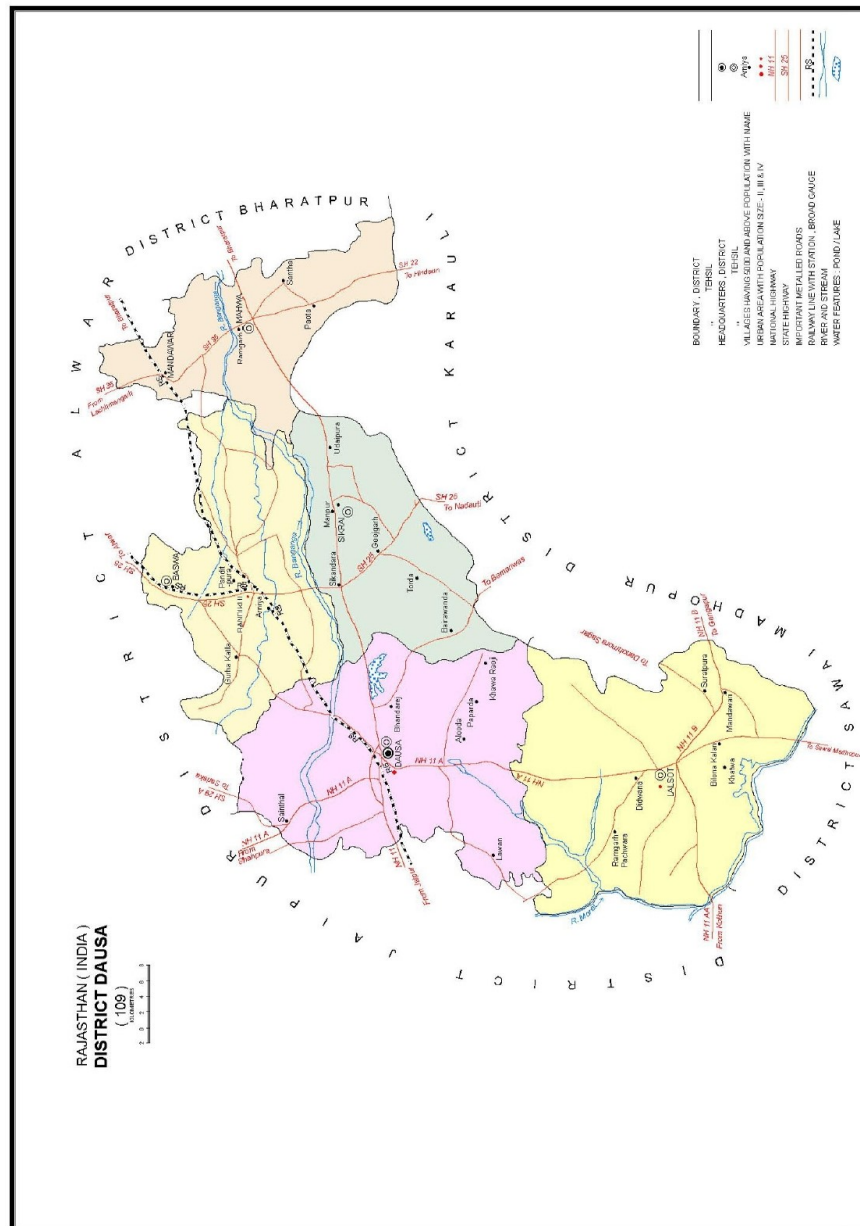


DISTRICT - DAUSA

Introduction

Dausa is situated in North Eastern region of the state, between 22°33' and 27°33' north latitudes and between 76°50' and 76°90' east longitudes. The district is situated on NH-11 from Jaipur to Agra which is just 55 Kms far from Jaipur. It is one of the 7 Districts of Jaipur division and is surrounded by Jaipur, Alwar, Sawai Madhopur, Karauli, Bharatpur and Tonk.

Dausa is believed to have been one of the habitations of pre-historic man. It is believed that there was existence of some human settlements during the chalcolithic era. Archaeological surveys in the region have found a number of stone circles on the sloping grounds to the north of the foot of the hill. A couple of them contained cromlechs, a few cairns and sepulchral mound of prehistoric date, deduced as the prehistoric cemetery.

Apart from these facts, Dausa also has ancient mythological significance. The town of Bhandarej, was originally known as the city of Bhadravati and finds mention in the great Indian epic Mahabharata.

During Medieval period, The Chauhans and Badgurjars ruled this land in 10th Century A.D. The city of Dausa, rose to fame when it became the first capital of Dundhar. This was in 1006, when the Kacchawaha Rajput king Duleh Rai annexed the region from the Gujjara-Pratiharas and the Menaj's control. The foundation that Dulha Rai, laid in Dausa resulted in Kingdom of Amber and later, Jaipur by the same dynasty.

According to the Census of 2011, the district of Dausa has a population of 1,634,409 out of which 857,787 are males and 776,622 are females. It accounts for 2.38 percent of the State population. The Geographical area of the district is 3,432 sq km which is 1 percent of the total state area. The district ranks 20th in terms of population and 32nd in terms of area and 3rd in terms of population density among all districts of the state.

Hills of Dausa district are parts of the North Aravali ranges. The Lalsot-Bayana Hill range runs from Lalsot to Bayana, demarcates the boundary between Dausa and Sawai Madhopur districts. The Aravali exposures have a perfect concordant sequence of beds from Lalsot to Bayana ridge. A belt of crystalline quartzite is found in hills from Dausa to Bhankari, schistose quartzite is also predominately exposed. The soil of the district is yellowish to dark brown dominantly fine textured, generally suitable for all type of crops.¹

Part A – Resource Mapping

Physical Resources

- **Minerals²**

The district having pre-Aravali quartzite's which are considered to be nearly 2,500 million-year-old. These rocks are mostly covered under a mantle of sand and alluvium. With a major unconformity these rocks are of Delhi supersub group, which is made up of Raialo, Alwar and Ajabgarh groups. The Alwar group consists of conglomeritic quartzites and schists, whereas the Ajabgarh group is mainly made up of schists, phylites marble and quartzites.

Primary minerals found in the district are silica sand, soap stone, dolomite and quartzite, whereas in secondary minerals - missionary stones, kankar, bajri, marble block, kharda, patti-katla slate stone and bricks are found.

Metallic minerals ore is found in Lalsot and Bandikui panchayat samities of the district, whereas in non-metallic minerals - glass sand, and soap stone are found in Khawa Rao ji, Bandikui and Geejgarh, dolomite in Sikrai, Lalsot and Bandikui; and Silica in Bharkri area. Apart from this, sand stone, limestone, silica and building stone are found in huge quantity in various parts of the district.

- **Agriculture³**

Dausa district lies in the Semi-Arid Eastern Plains Agro-Climatic Zone, according to the classification by Department of Agriculture, Government of Rajasthan. Soils in this zone are seirozems. The eastern part is alluvial, west and north-west regions have lithosols while the foothills are characterized by brown soils. Commonly grown crops in this zone in kharif season are pearl millet, sorghum and cluster bean and in rabi season are wheat, mustard and gram.

In 2018-19, total sown area was 366836 hectares, of which 166722 ha was sown in the Rabi season and 200114 ha was sown in Kharif season.⁴

- **Forests⁶**

Out of the total 3,432sq km of area in Dausa district, only 117 is under forest cover. As per the classification by Forest Survey of India, there is no area under very dense forest category, 12.00 under moderately dense forest category and the remaining 105.00 under open forest category.

Subsidiary edaphic types of dry tropical forests are found in the district where Dhok or Dhokra (*Anogeissus pendula*) is the most common tree. Other species found are Adoosa (*Adhatodavasica*); Gurjan (*Lanneacoromandelia*); Khirni (*Wrightia tinctoria*). Salar (*Boswellia serrata*); Jhingha (*Bauhinia recemosa*); Babul (*Acacia arabica*); Siris (*Albizzia lebbek*); Bar (*Ficus Bengalensis*); Gular (*Ficus recemosa*); Pipal (*Ficus religiosa*); Shisham (*Dalbergia sissoo*). Peelu (*SalvaderaOleoides*); Hingota (*Balanites aegyptica*); Karaya (*Sterculia urens*); Khejra (*Prosoplsspigera*); Khair (*Acacia catechu*); and Jamun (*Syzygiumcumini*). The timber obtained from the forests of the district is utilised for the manufacture of agricultural implements besides being used for roofing as well as for fuel purposes and for agricultural equipments.

The district is endowed with a variety of habitats. The district, although not rich in dense forest growth, it sustains considerable biological diversity. As far as the faunal regions are concerned, the district falls under Oriental region. Of the characteristic wildlife of the region, the wild animals still surviving in the district include the monkey, lemur (langoor), panther, black buck & the peafowl. Various types of fishes are also found in the tanks and bunds of district.

The hills in the Dausa district are covered with shrub forest mostly consisting of Dhak, Kiplra, Khari, Mahua, Khirana, Churail and Tendu, However the hills and flat ridges do not support good forest growth. During the dry season, the countr sides give a bare and desolate look. The Dausa jungles, in the old days were famous for their big games. Now howecer their population has drastically reduced. Panthers, wild boars, CHINKARA, Nilgai, Sambhar and Chital are still found in fair numbers. Be sides, the common Indian birds found every where, the area has panited partridges, bush quail and grew jungle fowl.

Industries

Industrially Dausa District should be considered as a backward district this is mainly due to the fact that earlier it was a part of Jaipur and could not get due attention despite the fact that it is well connected by rail, road and has vast deposited of minerals its surrounding areas.

- **Harshat Mata Temple – Abhaneri**

- **Jhajhirampura**

Abhaneri 88 kms from Jaipur on the Jaipur-Agra road is another attraction of Dausa, it is believed to be established by Raja Chandra. Originally named as AbhaNagri which means the city of brightness due to mispronunciation it is now called as Abhaneri. The Department of Tourism hosts a wonderful two-day “Abhaneri Festival” promoting heritage tourism in the area. Cultural performances and village camel safari are the main attractions of the festival. One of the popular places to visit in Abhaneri is the Chand Baori (stepwell). Built back in the eighth century, it is one of the deepest and largest step wells in India. The phenomenal structure is 19.5 meters in depth and features 1000 narrow steps, spanning 13 storeys.

- **Bhandarej**



Bhandarej is located about 65 km from Jaipur, on the Jaipur-Agra highway, and about 10 km from Dausa. Bhandarej, during Mahabharata times, was known as Bhadrawati. The walls, sculptures, decorative lattice work jaalis, terracotta utensils, etc., found in excavations, speak volumes about the ancient splendor of this place. The BhandarejBaori (step-well) and Bhadrawati Palace are popular places to visit, and are fine examples of the grand history of the region. Its history can be traced back to the 11th century, when the KachhawahaChieftanDulha Rai defeated the Bargujars and conquered Bhandarej. The region is also famous for carpet making.

- **Lotwara**



The village of Lotwara is located 110 Km from Jaipur. The biggest attraction of this village is the LotwaraGarh(Fort), which was built by Thakur Ganga Singh in the 17th century, as well as the large population of peacocks in the village. Located just 11 Km from Abhaneri, the best way to reach the village is by road.

- **Bandikui**



The Roman style Church for Protestant Christians is a popular attraction in Bandukui, located about 35 Km from Dausa.

Archaeological Monuments¹¹

- **Abaneri**



On the outskirts of the Abaneri village, a large sized mound measuring approximately 350 x 300 m and having a cultural deposit of 3-4 m has yielded coarse red ware with red slip and grey ware.

- **Harsatmata**



It is a dilapidated temple of which only the sanctum shorn of its superstructure has survived standing on two stepped terraces. The sanctum is pancharatha on plan with pillared mandapa and porch. The sanctum is enclosed by an ambulatory. The temple has a sculptured niche on each buttress of the wall. The cardinal niches show Vasudeva-Vishnu, Pradyumna and Balarama-Sankarshana respectively, on the south, west and north, indicating that the original temple was dedicated to Vishnu. At present, it enshrines an image of Devi, locally called Harshat Mata. The main attraction of the temple are its sculptures carved in the niches around the plinth of the upper terrace, exhibiting religious and secular themes which include dance, music, garden-sports and love, depicted with rich luxuriousness and a sense of gay abandon. The temple is assignable to the eighth century.

- **Banjaroki Chhatri**



It is a six pillared chhatri with a dome shaped roof. The pillars reused in the chhatri are superficially similar to the railing pillars of Bharhut. These carved pillars of white spotted red sandstone are datable to the pre-Kushana period.

- **Maheshra**

A small mound, situated adjacent to the village, measures about 150 x 100 m. originally the height of the mound is said to be about 4-5 m. but now it has been levelled for cultivation. Black slipped ware, grey ware and red ware have been collected from the cultivated field.

- **Raniwas**

This ancient site situated in a comparatively small area is littered with potsherds of coarse red ware belonging to the medieval period. The maximum height of the cultural deposit is even less than 1 m.

Human Resources

According to the 2011 Census, 6,84,495 persons in the district are workers. This constitutes 41.88 of the total population. Of these, 5,06,214 are main workers and 1,78,281 are marginal workers.

There are 10,145 migrant labourers in Dausa district. According to rajkaushal.rajasthan.gov.in, these belong to the following categories.

Food Processing & Agro Based Industries

These include dal mill, confectionery (toffee), pickles, jam, tomato paste, bread unit and biscuit unit,

Resource Based Industries

These include stone crusher, soap stone power, marble chips, dolomite powder, mine gang saw, quartz grinding and stand grinding.

Forest Based

These include wooden furniture.

Textiles Based

These include cotton dairy and carpets and handloom-based.

Engineering Based

These include agricultural implements, steel furniture, rolling shutter and automobile repairs.

Demand Based

These include rigid P.V.C pipe, re-refining of lube oils, botting and filling of LPC in cylinders, corrugated boxes and sheets, cement pipes and detergent power.
