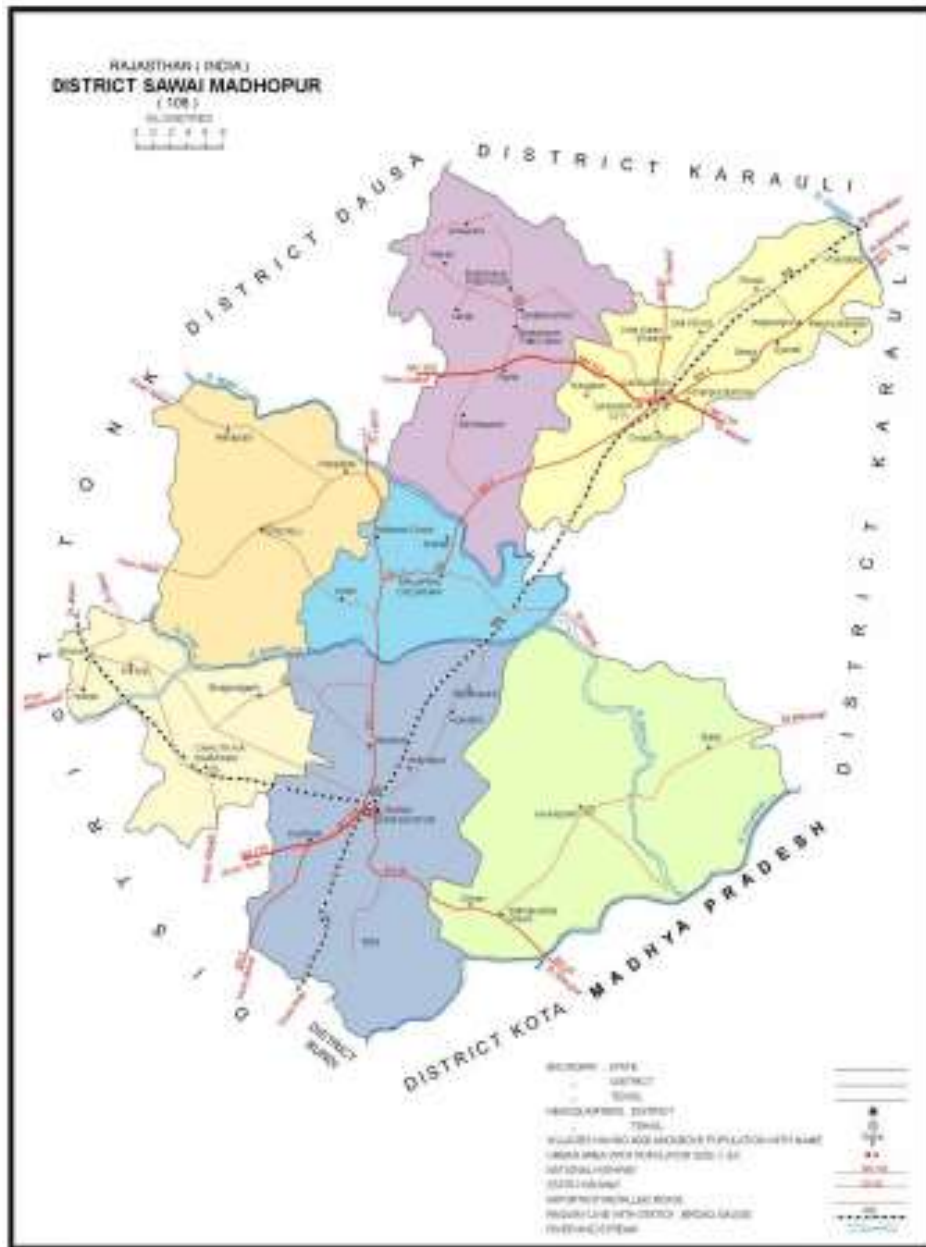


DISTRICT - SAWAI MADHOPUR

Introduction¹

Sawai Madhopur is situated in South Eastern region of Rajasthan, between 25°45' and 26°41' north latitudes and between 75°59' and 77° east longitudes. This district is surrounded from the north by Dausa district; Tonk from the east, Southeast has the Bundi district, Karauli in the northwest and Kota and Chambal River from the southwest direction. This district is in the Western India in the state of Rajasthan.

The early history of Sawai Madhopur originates in Ranthambore fort. The oldest settlements are located near the fort only. According to one popular belief Ranthambore Fort was built by Chauhan Rajput King Sapaldaksha in the year 944 AD, whereas, according to another school of thought the fort was constructed by Chauhan King Jayant in 1110 A.D.

During the course of medieval period, the fort of Ranthambore kept changing hands till 1765, when Mughals handed over the fort to the Jaipur ruler, Sawai Madho Singh.

According to the Census of 2011, the district of Sawai Madhopur has a population of 13,35,551 out of which 7,04,031 are males and 6,31,520 are females. It accounts for 1.95 percent of the State population. The Geographical area of the district is 4,498 sq km which is 1.31 percent of the total state area. The district ranks 26th in terms of population and 29th in terms of area and 12th in terms of population density among all districts of the state.

The district is rectangular in its general shape and falls in the category of the eastern district of the state. It has partly plain and partly undulating hilly terrain. The plain part is fertile and soil in most parts is in light & sandy. South and south east portion of the district comprise hills and broken ground which form a part of a vast track of rugged region enclosing the narrow valley of the Chambal river.

Ranges of Aravalli hills lie in the northern western and southern parts of the district. The height district varies from 450 to 600 meters above sea-level. The highest peak in the north-western Aravali hill located in Bamanwas tehsil is 527 meters high Bhairan and Utgir are notable peak in the south of the district.

The Banas, Moral and Chambal are the main rivers in the district. The Banas is the largest among them. It is also important to note that no part of the district falls in the category of a desert and also there are no natural springs in the district.²

Part A – Resource Mapping

Physical Resources

- **Minerals³**

Sawai Madhopur district is endowed with a variety of mineral resources both metallic and non-metallic. The metallic minerals include lead copper and iron ore whereas the non-metallic minerals comprise limestone, clays, silica sand and talc. The district is also endowed with extensive resources of diverse rocks suitable for use as building and decorative stones. Cement Grade limestone occurs around Phalodi, NilaDongri, Malodi and Naroli while silica sand occurs near Naroli and Totwara.

- **Agriculture⁴**

Sawai Madhopur district lies in the Flood prone Eastern Plains Agro-Climatic Zone, according to the classification by Department of Agriculture, Government of Rajasthan. The eastern part is alluvial prone to water logging soils of recently alluvial calcareous nature. Commonly grown crops in this zone in kharif season are pearl millet, groundnut and clusterbean and in rabi season are wheat, mustard, barley and gram.

In 2018-19, total sown area was 457144 hectares, of which 268822 ha was sown in the Rabi season and 188322 ha was sown in Kharif season.⁵

- **Forests⁷**

Out of the total 4,498 sq. km of area in Sawai Madhopur district, only 462.69 sq. km is under forest cover. As per the classification by Forest Survey of India, there is no area under very

dense forest category, 153.92 sq. km under moderately dense forest category and the remaining 308.77sq. km under open forest category.

The important trees found in the district are Neem (*Azadirachta indica*), Beri (*Ziziphus Jujuba*), Dhok (*Anogeissus pendula*), Aranja (*Acacia Leucophloca*), Tendu (*Diospyros melanoxylon*), Gurjan (*LaneaCaromaandelica*), Salar (*Boswellia Serrata*), Khirni (*Wrightiatomentoes*), Suntha (*Buhiniarecemos*), Khair (*Acacia catechur*), Jamun (*Syzygiumcumini*), Aam (*Mangifera indica*), Gameri (*Gamelina arborea*), Bamboo (*DhandracalamusBtricius*), Khejra (*Prosopis specigera*), Pila (*Saluadoraoleodes*), Goya (*Dichrastachyscineria*), Kair (*Capparis decidua*), Hingot (*Balanites oegyoptica*), Arni (*Clerodendraonuisorum*), and Pipal (*Ficus bengalensis*). The common herbs and grasses found are Andhijhara (*Achvranthusaspora*), Chichda (*Pupalialappaca*), Pold (Apludamutica), Kali lamp (*Hetropoconcontortus*) and Lampla (*Aristida*). The forest of the district meet the local demands for small timber, firewood, charcoal, grass and grazing, fencing and thatching material, bamboos, tendupatta, gum, dhok leaves, honey, wax, medicinal herbs, flowers, Kattha, Karanj and other minor forest products.

Sawai Madhopur district abounds in wildlife and has a wide variety of evenly balanced fauna. The area pulsates with innumerable, huge mass of animals, birds, reptiles, fish, tiger, leopard or panther, wild dog (Dhole), Sambhar, nil gai, chital, chinkara, wild pigs and sloth bear are found commonly. The birds found are peafowl, doves, parakeets, owls, egrets, pond herons, gray and purple herons, storks, whistling teal, nukta, comb-duck chuckle teal, spot bill and coots.

Significant religious sites and places of worship that are revered by residents and tourists alike are as follows.

- **Ghushmeshwar Temple**



Enshrined in the Puranas, the Ghushmeshwar Temple is believed to be 12th or the last of the Jyotirlingas of Lord Shiva. Situated at the Siwar village in Sawai Madhopur, this temple has many mythological stories weaved around it. The most prominent, and popular story tells of the greatness of Lord Shiva, who resurrected his devotee Ghusma's son, and even promised to abide in Devagiri hills as Ghushmeshwar after her name, Ghushma.

- **Jama Masjid**



Located in the heart of the bustling city is the Jama Masjid, Rajasthan's finest mosque. Delicately frescoed inside and out with intricate patterns, mosque still contains some of the ancient lamps. This fine piece of architecture began construction under the first Nawab of Tonk, Nawab Ameer Khan and completely by his son in 1298.

- **AmreshwarMahadev**



Nestled amidst the high hills on the way to Ranthambore National Park is the sacred Amreshwar Mahadev temple. The representation of 12 JyotirLingas and a 11ft high Shivling attracts a lot of devotees to come and seek blessing of Lord Mahadev.

- **Kailadevi**



About 23kms from Karauli stands the Kaila Devi temple dedicated to the Mother Goddess. In the months of March-April and September-October, devotees celebrate the colourful Kaila Devi fair and worship the Goddess for the fulfilment of their wishes.

- **Shri Mahavirji Temple**



Located on the banks of Gambhiri River, stands the pilgrimage site dedicated to Sri Mahavirji, the 24th Jain Tirthankara. This temple has a long story of existence and is known to be one of the miraculous pilgrimages of Jains.

Non-religious Sites¹¹

- **Ranthambore Fort**



The noteworthy Ranthambore Fort was built by the Chauhan rulers in the 10th century. Due to its strategic location, it was ideal to keep the enemy at bay. The fort is also related to the historical legend of the royal women performing 'jauhar' (self-immolation) when the Muslim invader Alauddin Khilji laid siege on this fort in 1303. The fort is characterised by temples, tanks, massive gates and huge walls.

- **Tonk**

Lying 96 kms from Jaipur on the route to Ranthambore, Tonk was once the stronghold of the Pathan tribesmen of Afghanistan. By and by this quiet township passed through the hands of several rulers. Modern Tonk was founded by the Nawab Ameer Khan as a result of a treaty with the British in 1818. Tonk has several colonial buildings, painted mosques, quasi-hindu architecture and a repository of ancient manuscripts and books. Tonk has several other names by which it is known, like- Rajasthan ka Lucknow, Adab ka Gulshan, Hindu Muslim Ekta ka Masaan and many more.

- **SunheriKothi**

Constructed in 1824 by Nawab Ameer Khan, the Sunheri Kothi was later renovated by Nawaab Ibrahim Ali Khan. The exterior of the Mansion of Gold completely belies the grandeur within. In-lay work with mirrors, gilded stucco, coloured glass, mosaic and lapez lazuli, painted and polished floors reflecting in the stained glass window leaves visitors completely impressed. This is a beautiful specimen of Hindu Muslim cohesion of architecture.

- **Hathi Bhata**



Situated just 10kms from Kakod on the route to Sawai Madhopur is Hathi Bhata, carved out as a single stone in the shape of a huge life size stone elephant. To top it up, inscription on the

rock tells us the story of Raja Nal and Damyanti. This monument was constructed in the year 1200 by Ram Nath Slat, during the reign of Sawai Ram Singh.

- **KhandharFort**



The imposing Khandar Fort is a place worth visiting and is situated just 45 kms from Sawai Madhopur. This magnificent fortification was long ruled by the Sisodia Kings of Mewar after which it was taken over by the Mughals. It is believed that the king of this fort never lost a war.

- **Ranthambore**



Situated 14 km from Sawai Madhopur, the Ranthambore Park gets its name from the Ranthambore Fort situated within its boundaries. The National Park, situated amidst the Aravalis and Vindhya ranges is spreads over an area of 392 sq.km of thick forest punctuated with pleasant waterfalls. It is home to the elusive tiger, other animals found here include chinkara, sambhar, cheetal and over 300 species of birds.

- **Shilpgram - Sawai Madhopur**



Located near the Ramsinghpura village, about 9 km from Sawai Madhopur is the Shilpgram Museum. Though we name it as a museum, it is more of a craft village that encompasses and showcases the tremendous diversity in arts, crafts, and cultures of the various Indian states. Shilpgram is a living ethnographic museum, established with an aim to empower craftspeople, especially women, to use their skills as means of economic self-sufficiency, and to bring to the world the cultural heritage of Rajasthan. An embodiment of Rajasthani culture and heritage through arts and crafts, Shilpgram is a site that needs to be seen to be understood and appreciated. If you have a keen eye for arts and crafts and haven't been to Shilpgram yet, it's time to add it to your bucket list!

Archaeological¹²

- **AlanpurJain Temple**

The notable Jaina temple, known as Chamatkari, dating from the early medieval period, is situated outside the city and dedicated to lord Adinatha. The temple compound is enclosed by a modern high parapet wall with small cells all round and is entered from the west. The main shrine is situated in the centre of the courtyard and is enclosed by high wall with entrance in the north. The garbhagriha facing east, is pancharatha on plan with circumambulatory passage around. The sikhara is curvilinear.

- **AlanpurBaor**

A four line Persian inscription on a rectangular stone slab, fixed in the Ghori Baori in Alanpur village, belongs to AlauddinFidan Shah, son of Mahmud Shah Khalji I, Sultan of Malwa. It is dated A.H. 874 (A.D. 1469-70) and records construction of the step-well by Khwaja Jahan son of Bir Ali Turk Khurasani. The slab now broken into four pieces has been taken to the Ranthambhor Fort collection of antiquities.

- **Ranthambhor**



Ranthambhore had one of the strongest fort of India, which formed significant part of the Chahamana kingdom of Sakambhari. It is said to have been constructed by Maharaja Jayanta in fifth century A.D. The Yadavas ruled over it till they were expelled by Prithviraja Chauhan in the twelfth century. Subsequently, the fort was occupied by the Muslim rulers of Delhi. Hammir Deo was the most powerful ruler of Ranthambhore. He patronized art and literature. The fort is well protected by a massive fortification wall provided with stepped and Z-shaped gateway with two strong and massive doors. Inside the fort, the Hammir Badi Kachahari, ChhotiKachahari, BattisKhambha Chhatri, Hamir Palace and Rani Palace, with later additions and in dilapidated condition, are important secular structures. Among temples, the Ganesa temple is important besides a few Jaina temples

Human Resources

According to the 2011 Census, 5,78,068 persons in the district are workers. This constitutes 43.28 of the total population. Of these, 4,18,555 are main workers and 1,59,513 are marginal workers.
